

Christ is Born!

Blessed Sunday to you all! I trust that you have been enjoying the celebration of our Lord's Nativity.

On January 22nd (January 23rd should January 22nd fall on a Sunday) the Catholic Church in America observes the **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children** (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Pro-Life Activities: January 22 Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, at USCCB, <https://www.usccb.org/committees/pro-life-activities/january-roe-events/january-22-day-of-prayer>). Let us continue to pray and act that every life – born or unborn – here in the United States and throughout the entire world will be respected from conception to natural death! Let us concomitantly pray and act that the abortions in this country and in other corners of the world will one day, our good Lord willing, cease to be performed once and for all!

Today, **January 23rd** the **Liturgy at St. Anne Church** will be offered in **pro-life intentions** at the request of the Greater Youngstown Area Chapter of the Knights of Columbus. Following the Liturgy, there will be a **free will offering breakfast in the parish hall**, sponsored by the Chapter (in particular, the host councils being 2935, 3813, and 3930) to which everyone is invited.

On September 30, 2019 our Holy Father Pope Francis issued an Apostolic Letter in the form of "Motu Proprio" titled *Aperuit Illis*, instituting thereby **Sunday of the Word of God** for the entire Catholic Church (Pope Francis, Apostolic Letter issued "Motu Proprio" *Aperuit Illis* (30 September 2019): https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/motu_proprio/documents/papa-francesco-motu-proprio-20190930_aperuit-illis.html) that is to be observed annually on Sunday between January 21st and 27th (see the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Sunday of the Word of God: <https://www.usccb.org/committees/divine-worship/sunday-word-god>). This year it is celebrated today, **January 23rd**. In *Aperuit Illis*, Pope Francis is suggesting for the parishes to take up the "initiatives to make the Sacred Scripture more accessible to believers, to increase their gratitude for so great a gift, and to help them to strive daily to embody and bear witness to its teachings" (Pope Francis, Apostolic Letter issued "Motu Proprio" *Aperuit Illis* (30 September 2019), § 2: https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/motu_proprio/documents/papa-francesco-motu-proprio-20190930_aperuit-illis.html). May the Word of the Living God always dwell in your hearts, be frequently read and spoken through your lips, and may it always be embodied in your daily actions!

AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE AND FAMILY

The Church is celebrating the Year “Amoris Laetitia Family” an initiative of Pope Francis, which aims to reach and be implemented in every parish, diocese and family. The family (as the Domestic Church) deserves a year of celebrations, so that it can be placed at the center of commitment and care from every pastoral and ecclesial reality.

Goals of this Special Year of the Family are: share the content of the Apostolic Exhortation; proclaim that the Sacrament of Marriage is a gift; enable families to become active agents of the family apostolate; make young people aware of the importance of formation in the truth of love and in the gift of self; and broaden the vision and scope of the family apostolate.

Each month, we will provide a Meditation from Pope Francis’ Amoris Laetitia to help our families grow and celebrate during this extraordinary year. This month we reflect on Charity:

We learn of God’s love through the Scriptures, the testimony of God Himself, where we read that “whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me” (Mt 25:40). The Scriptures therefore instruct all, including families, to practice charity because Christ is present in every person, especially the poor and needy.

In Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis called on the family to have an “expanding fruitfulness” that seeks to give life outside of one’s own family through charity. Charity is a living out of the family’s kingly mission to serve others. Pope benedict XVI explains that there are three unique elements to fruitful Christian charity that distinguish it from any other form of social assistance: a heartfelt concern for the fullness of another person’s humanity, a “heart which sees” and faith.

Pope benedict XVI reminds Christians that it is not enough to “meet the needs of the moment,” such as providing food or shelter. They must also “dedicate themselves to others with heartfelt concern, enabling them to experience the richness of their humanity”, one of the beautiful ways to do this is to allow the other person to give back to the giver, welcoming their gifts of friendship and faith. To allow this deeper giving and sharing, families need “a formation of the heart” from an “encounter with God in Christ which awakens their love and opens their spirits to others.” This new heart looks upon love of neighbor not as “a commandment imposed, so to speak, from without, but a consequence deriving from their faith, a faith which becomes active through love (cf. Gal 5:6).” It is a “heart that sees” like the Good samaritan. “This heart sees where love is needed and acts accordingly.” Finally, Christian charity must not leave God and Christ out of the equation because it is concerned with the whole man. as Pope Benedict XVI points out, “often the deepest cause of suffering is the very absence of God.” Families should therefore naturally share their faith; with the help of grace, they will know when they should converse about the faith and when they should silently share the faith through loving actions.

1. What are some specific ways in which our family practices hospitality within our home? In what ways is hospitality challenging for our family, and in what ways does it help our family grow in grace and happiness?
2. Have we ever thought of hospitality in terms of welcoming the other as Christ? How might this calling of Christian hospitality change our practices of hospitality?
3. What are some ways as a family to grow in hospitality? How might we open our home more to the poor, lonely, brokenhearted and neglected? Is there someone who has a rough family life that could use some time around our family for the support and encouragement that love offers?
