

PRAY FOR UKRAINE!

My dear Friends,

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Blessed Sunday to all of you and your loved ones! I trust that my message found everyone well and sound and that you have been enjoying the summer. Tomorrow, August 29th, we are celebrating the feast of the Beheading of the Honorable and Glorious Prophet, the Forerunner and Baptizer of the Lord, John, which is a fast day unless one is legitimately excused from fasting.

On Thursday, September 1st, we begin the new Church (or Liturgical) Year. Hence, to wish all of you a happy new year is only in order! This impels me first and foremost to express my deep gratefulness to our Lord for the copious blessings that He has been bestowing on our two parishes during this Church Year that draws to a close. It is especially through the Eucharistic celebrations as well as other liturgical services, which we partook in during this Church Year that we were praising the Lord for His greatness, were thanking Him for His immense graces that He daily bestows upon us as well as were asking Him to bless us and our loved ones, having been sanctified through these liturgical celebrations every time we participated in them. As we, the Church, commence the new Church Year, let us implore our Lord to continue to bless our two parishes with the immeasurable abundance of His blessings, especially during this COVID-19 pandemic, so that we could continue to be truly genuine children of God, whom our Heavenly Father adopted through His beloved Son by the power of His life-giving Holy Spirit, shining forth the light that we received from Jesus Christ unto all the people that we encounter! Let us moreover, ask our Lord to send us His peace, especially to send His peace on Ukraine. Blessed new Church Year to you and your loved ones!

We also celebrate now on September 1st in the Catholic Church (since 2015) as well as among the Orthodox Christians the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (this celebration was actually adopted by the Catholic Church from the Orthodox who have been celebrating it since 1989) (see *Creation Justice Ministries* at <https://www.creationjustice.org/world-day-of-prayer-for-the-care-of-creation.html>). Hence, let us pray on this day in a very special way for the protection of the environment we live in, so that everyone on earth may realize the importance of the responsible care for our Lord's creation, which, in my opinion, can only happen if the people in the world establish an authentic moral order, stemming from our Supreme Creator – our Lord Himself!

Sadly, **the situation in our beloved Ukraine still remains grave.** My native land is still under a heavy attack from the side of Russia and whoever else sides with it in this horrible war... So many victims, including innocent children... How much longer will this bloodshed last? Right now, the People of Ukraine are being crucified... in fact, it is Christ Himself Who is being crucified again... Yet, life does not end with death! After the crucifixion and death comes resurrection! The resurrection will come for Ukraine as well! Our risen Lord continues to embrace all people, who grieve due to having lost their loved ones because of the war in Ukraine, asking them to have faith in Him and not be afraid, for one day they will see their loved ones again, as this is a temporary absence. Jesus is telling the whole world just as He addressed His beloved friend Lazarus' sister Martha before Christ brought Lazarus back to life: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26 (NRSVCE)). Lord Jesus, we believe in You, give us life eternal!

In the meantime, let us continue to **pray and act for the end of the war in Ukraine as well as for the conversion of Ukraine's aggressors** and, as a Ukrainian citizen, I'd like to tell all of you: THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT OF OUR SUFFERING BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN UKRAINE! Ukraine direly needs our help right now! If you would like to **help financially** your brothers and sisters in Ukraine, please **see a separate notice in the bulletin of how you can help.** No amount is too small, yet please be generous, and I thank you in advance for your munificence! May our Good Lord reward you manifold for it in this life and in the life to come!

A Request from Sr. Ann Laszok

Glory to Jesus Christ!

I recently received a request from a former participant of our English Catechetical camp in Ivano-Frankivsk named Dmytro Vytvytski. He would like to come to Manor College in Jenkintown, PA, to study Business Administration. I remember Dima well as a talented, lively, but well-behaved student. He was in our Advanced English group then. Although he is not an orphan, he is economically challenged because of the war which does not allow any reasonable exchange rate. The US dollar is equal to 37 hryvni.

The Sisters have agreed to offer him a Work-Study grant of \$5,000 and Manor is offering a \$5,000 grant. We need to raise another \$10,000 for the first year's tuition. I am looking for a host family to sponsor him so that he does not have to pay the additional \$10,000 for Room & Board.
