# **Glory to Jesus Christ!**

Blessed Sunday to all of you! I trust that my message found you and your loved ones all well and sound.

We began **the Apostles Fast** this year on June 5<sup>th</sup> (also known as *Petrivka* in our Church) that will last till June 29<sup>th</sup> – the feast of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul. As we commenced this holy time of fasting, I wholeheartedly wish everyone to have a very blessed and spiritually fruitful fast, and I hope that this year's *Petrivka* will not be for you a pure technicality, but a time to prepare your hearts and minds worthily for the celebration of the feast of Holy Apostles Peter and Paul.

During the month of June, we are celebrating Moleben to Christ the Lover of Mankind in the intention of peace and justice in Ukraine (please follow the bulletin weekly for details). On Sundays, the Moleben will be celebrated immediately before the Divine Liturgy at each church. If you would like to go to confession on any given Sunday in June, please either let me know after the Liturgy or make an appointment with me.

We, Ohioans, need to take unwavering action against the proposed pro-abortion amendment to Ohio Constitution and VOTE NO on this amendment on the General Election Day, November 7<sup>th</sup>, or whenever you'll be voting this year! Let's unite in prayer and action, reaffirming our firm YES TO LIFE and NO TO DEATH! IF OUR LORD IS WITH US, WHO COULD BE AGAINST US (cf. Romans 8:31)?!

Sadly, the situation in our beloved Ukraine continues to remain grave. The country is still under a heavy attack from the side of Russia and whoever else sides with it in this horrible war... So many victims, including innocent children... How much longer will this bloodshed last? Right now, the People of Ukraine are being crucified... in fact, it is Christ Himself Who is being crucified again... Yet, life does not end with death! After the crucifixion and death comes resurrection! The resurrection will come for Ukraine as well! Today our risen Lord is embracing all people, who grieve due to having lost their loved ones because of the war in Ukraine, asking them to have faith in Him and not be afraid, for one day they will see their loved ones again, as this is a temporary absence. # Lord's Blessings and Heartfelt Congratulations to Ill Graduates!

# 2023 Graduate: Joel Kreuzwieser

Joel Kreuzwieser graduated Summa Cum Laude with a 3.979 GPA from The Catholic University of America in Washington DC with a Bachelor of Science in Physics and a Bachelor of Arts in Music (General). Joel is the son of Kirk and Kit Kreuzwieser and has two sisters, Micaela and Arielle, both graduates of St. Vincent College in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, and a brother, Jeremy, currently a student athlete of St. Vincent College. Joel became a member of Holy Trinity Ukrainian Catholic Church in 2012, the same year he began altar serving for the parish. To this day, he and his brother still altar serve on Sundays and on Holy Days. Joel also served for 2 years as a Catechist/Sunday School Teacher for Eastern Christian Formation from 2017-2019.

During his time at The Catholic University of America, Joel took to heart the importance of a good work ethic along with the university's inspirational motto "Deus Lux Mea Est," which means "God is my light," by joining the University Honors Program. He was inspired to pursue physics as his primary degree because of the great minds that contributed to its advancement as well as the many fields in which it is applied such as engineering, medicine, astronomy, biology, and chemistry. To this day, he still looks up to Isaac Newton, Albert Einstein, and Nikola Tesla as inspirational titans of physics. At the same time, Joel believes in the necessity of an artistic influence in one's life. He chose to pursue his secondary degree in music not only to instill within himself and others the value of music, but also to serve as a reminder of the value of balancing one's interests and passions no matter how different or enigmatic they appear to be from each other. Physics and music work hand in hand to please the sinews and faculties of his mind.

Despite the workload that two majors brought him, Joel was quite active on campus. He would regularly attend mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Liturgy at the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine of the Holy Family, and late night mass at St. Vincent Chapel. Joel was also a student athlete. He ran for CUA's Cross Country and Track and Field Teams during his entire time at CUA, posting a personal best of 28:27 at the 8k, a personal best of 2:05 at the 800m, and a personal best of 4:21 at the 1500m. He would also annually participate in Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service with his team, assisting the monks at the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America to take down Christmas decorations and pull weeds in the fields. Joel also took up an undergraduate teaching assistantship for Spring 2022 for the Department of Physics at CUA, grading midterms and final exams, assisting other TA's and postdoctorates in setting up lab equipment, and holding tutoring sessions. He was a percussionist for the music school's Wind Ensemble for all 4 years, performing with a wide variety of instruments ranging from mallets, drums, cymbals, etc. He also performed percussion in the CUA orchestra in Fall 2021, Spring 2022, and Fall 2022. To close out his time at CUA, Joel hosted a Senior Piano Recital on April 16, 2023 at Ward Recital Hall. He performed works by Scarlatti, Bach, Barber, Beethoven, Debussy, and debuted two of his own musical compositions. To this day, Joel is very grateful for the help, guidance, and instruction that his piano teacher Dr. Francesca Hurst gave him to improve his piano skills throughout his 4 years at CUA as well as the help, guidance, and instruction that his previous piano teacher Sean Baran gave him that provided the foundation prior to his time at CUA.

The principle by which Joel lives in the field of scientific research is summarized by Johannes Kepler: "O God, I am thinking Thy thoughts after Thee." Joel's experience in the field of research blossomed despite the hardships of the COVID-19 pandemic. He obtained an undergraduate research position for Summer 2021 at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner Research Institute of the Department of Biomedical Engineering in Cleveland, Ohio, working in Dr. Vijay Krishna's Lab on testing a research proposal involving the application of infrared laser lithotripsy and nanotechnology for treating kidney stones. The research produced fruitful results which were presented in April 2022 at CUA's annual University Research Day; it was awarded the Best Undergraduate Poster. The next year, for Summer 2022, Joel took up an undergraduate research position at the Vitreous State Laboratory in Dr. John Philip's Lab on CUA's campus, working in collaboration with the Raub Lab of

the Department of Biomedical Engineering and the Nehmetallah Lab of the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science on analyzing the polarimetric properties of electrofabricated chitosan membranes using Mueller Matrix Imaging Polarimetry through Matlab. The results were presented at the end of the summer before VSL faculty and REU physics students at the Physics REU/Vitreous State Laboratory Scholars Conference and then presented again in April 2023 at University Research Day.

In the end, Joel was inducted into 3 honors societies. He was inducted into the Phi Eta Sigma National Honors Society in November 2020 for outstanding academic scholarship during freshman year. He was recently inducted this past May into the Phi Beta Kappa Honors Society for high attainments in liberal scholarship and the Sigma Pi Sigma National Physics and Astronomy Honors Society for high scholarship and service in physics and astronomy. Joel made the Dean's List 3 times and made the Dean's List with Distinction 5 times. He was awarded Honors in Liberal Studies at CUA's annual Honors Convocation this past May for completing the University Honors Program Liberal Studies seguence.

The path that God has laid out for Joel takes him to Vanderbilt University School of Medicine in Nashville, Tennessee, where he will begin working towards his Doctorate in Medical Physics this Fall. Joel credits his family, friends old and new, teachers, professors, priests, and fellow colleagues throughout the years for the impact they had on him because he truly believes that the Holy Trinity was working through them to guide him on his spiritual journey through life. ### FASTING & ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS FOR THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

In accordance with statute 403 of *The Statutes of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of St. Josaphat in Parma*, "As each Christian is called to ongoing repentance and amendment of life, the ancient practice of fasting is to be maintained. All those from 14 to 59 years of age, inclusively, must abstain from meat on Holy Saturday and each and every Friday of Lent (the Great Fast), as well as Christmas Eve, December 24 and Theophany Eve, January 5. These faithful must also abstain from meat and all dairy food (including milk, eggs, cheese, etc.) on the first day of the Great Fast (the Monday which follows Cheesefare Sunday) and on Holy and Great Friday. Pregnant and nursing mothers, the ill and infirm, those who work at hard physical labor and the very poor are excused" (statute 403, *The Statutes of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of St. Josaphat in Parma*, 19 August 1994). The statute continues: "The eparch can dispense all the faithful of the eparchy as well as any individuals for a good reason from any of these fasting prescriptions. A pastor may also dispense individual parishioners for a good reason. He cannot, however, dispense the entire parish" (ibid.). Moreover, according the article 472 of the 1999 *Pastoral Guide of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States of America* (the guide that "supplements the Statutes of the Eparchy of St. Josaphat in Parma" in our eparchy (see article 4 of the *Pastoral Guide*); the guide's revised version is forthcoming), "[t]he periods of penitence and their respective duration are:

- Great Lent, extending from the Monday after Cheesefare Sunday to the Saturday of Lazarus. And Great and Holy Week, extending from Great Monday to Great and Holy Saturday inclusively.
- The preparation for the Birth of Jesus Christ in the Flesh (*Pylypivka*) begins on the day..." after "... the feast of St. Philip (November 15), and lasts until the Eve of the Nativity of Christ (December 24) inclusively.
- The Apostles' Fast ([P]etrivka) extends from the Monday following the Sunday of All Saints, and continues through to the day preceding the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul (June 28), inclusively.
- The Dormition Fast (*Spasivka*) begins on August [1] and lasts until the eve of the Dormition of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 14), inclusively"
- (article 472, *Pastoral Guide of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States of America* (Philadelphia, PA, 1999)).

# Furthermore, the "[g]eneral rules governing abstinence [are]:

- Meat is to be understood as including not only the flesh but also those parts of warm-blooded animals that cannot be melted down, e.g., the liver, lungs, blood, graves, etc. Although it is not the authentic practice of the Tradition[,] the meat of fish and crustaceans may be eaten, as well of those mammals, that live constantly in water, as, e.g., whales.
- Dairy Products are to be understood as comprising products derived from mammals and birds, but not regarded as meat, e.g., cheese, lard, butter, milk, and its by-products, eggs, etc.
- Fats of plant origin, e.g., those derived from olives, coconuts, seeds of the sunflower and of the pumpkin, may be used.
- Voluntary penance, prayers for the intentions of the hierarchs of the Church, Bishop of Rome, the Major Archbishop, the Metropolitan, and the Eparchial Bishop; voluntary offerings to the Church, the seminaries, the Church in Ukraine, self-denial of alcohol, smoking, attendance at entertainment, etc., may be supplementary only with permission of a confessor. Bread and water alone [are] a good fast.
- Priests who possess a pastoral assignment are empowered to grant dispensations or relaxation from the laws of abstinence to individual persons as well as to individual families.

The following are exempt from abstinence:

- (1) the poor who live on alms;
- (2) sick and frail persons;
- (3) convalescents who are returning to their strength;
- (4) pregnant women, and mothers who are nursing their children;
- (5) persons who perform hard labor;
- (6) children who have not completed their seventh [currently, fourteenth] year of age;

(7) [p]ersons have completed their 59th year of age" with permission of their pastor or confessor" [the clause "with permission of their pastor or confessor" is no longer valid... it could have been an original error, too...] (article 474, *Pastoral Guide of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States of America* (Philadelphia, PA, 1999)).

Furthermore, in accordance with article 475 of the *Pastoral Guide*, "In virtue of rules enacted by the Synod of Bishops under the presidency of the Major Archbishop in 1969 the following rules of abstinence oblige in the United States:

Abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the year except those which occur in privileged weeks and on holydays of Our Lord and of the Mother of God.

Abstinence from meat and all dairy products on the first day of the Great Fast (Lent) and on Good Friday.

Abstinence from meat, in addition to eating only one full meal and a smaller snack, milk products being permitted in accordance with local custom: on Christmas Eve, Epiphany Eve, Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14) and Beheading of St. John the Baptist (August 29).

During the Great Fast, the faithful may also maintain the tradition of abstaining from meat on Wednesdays" (ibid., article 475).

Please advise Ukrainian youth of graduating high-school age or older that the 2023 Ukrainian Technological Society Scholarship Application Form and directions are now available at www.utspgh.org. The scholarships are available to students of Ukrainian heritage domiciled in the tri-state PA, OH, WV area around Pittsburgh, PA. This year, in a trial, the Society is opening up the scholarship awards to Ukrainian youth seeking or continuing a post high-school education (i.e., college, trade school, nursing, business school, law school, medical school, etc.). The deadline for submitting completed applications and official course transcripts is July 6, 2023.

This year, the Society will make its 51st presentation of scholarship awards. 

### NOTE ON SUNDAYS AND HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

Under ordinary circumstances, the faithful in St. Josaphat Eparchy (baptized adults and children) have the obligation to attend a Catholic Church service on the following days, participating in a Divine Liturgy or Vespers the night before or a Roman Mass if need be (including vigil services in all three instances) unless absent due to a legitimate reason (if a person, for example, sings in the choir of a non-Catholic church on Sunday and/or holy day of obligation, this is not considered a legitimate reason not to attend a Catholic Church service on that day, hence, the person still has to fulfill his or her Sunday/holy day obligation on that day):

- all Sundays of the entire year;
- Theophany of Our Lord (January 6th);
- Annunciation of the Most Holy Theotokos (March 25th);
- Ascension of Our Lord (40th day (Thursday) after Easter);
- Holy Apostles Peter & Paul (June 29th);
- Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos (August 15th);
- Nativity of Our Lord (December 25th).

Please also keep in mind that if a person does not attend church on these days, he or she commits a mortal sin (with the exception of children who did not reach the age of reason yet and hence cannot commit a sin), provided of course all three conditions for a mortal sin are present: grave matter (Ten Commandments), which it is, full knowledge, and deliberate consent, and, hence, is forbidden to receive Holy Communion until the person goes to confession, which is applicable to any mortal sin. On all other feast days, the faithful are encouraged to attend church service(s).

In cases of an imminent death of a family member, please do not wait until the last minute for the pastor to administer last rites to the dying. Please call <u>immediately</u>.

# NOTE ON HOLY SACRAMENTS OF THE EUCHARIST & RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

Generally, Catholics (and some non-Catholics under certain conditions) receive Holy Communion worthily if they do not have even one mortal sin on his/her soul (one sins mortally when all of the following three conditions are present: grave matter (10 Commandments), full knowledge, and deliberate consent), and, usually, these are people who go to confession more or less frequently; one is permitted to receive Holy Communion with the venial sins on his/her soul. Otherwise, if one receives Holy Communion unworthily, namely with mortal sin(s) on his/her soul and is aware of it, committing it with deliberate consent, one commits another mortal sin. Although, certainly, it is possible to live one's life without committing even one mortal sin for a long time and, hence, have no need for confession for a long time, such people could be considered exceptions. Also, in accordance with the Church Commandments (also known as the Church Precepts), a minimal requirement is for a person to go to confession at least once a year as well as to receive Holy Communion at least during the Easter season: to go to confession provided one committed at least one mortal sin and to receive Holy Communion provided one did not commit even one mortal sin.
