


George Delgado, M.D.



George Delgado, M.D., is the president and founder of Steno Institute. Since 2005, he has been the Medical Director of Culture of Life Family Services (COLFS) in San Diego, California. He was also the founder of the Abortion Pill Reversal (APR) program, now called Abortion Pill Rescue. The APR program provides a medically safe protocol, using progesterone, to reverse the effects of the drug mifepristone, which is now used in over 30% of the one million annual abortions in the U.S. Since 2008, over 1000 wom-

en have given birth to healthy babies thanks to the use of the APR protocols developed, studied and promulgated by Dr. Delgado and his team.In 2018, because of the APR success, Dr. Delgado partnered with Heartbeat International, the largest pro-life organization in the world, including over 2500 affiliated pregnancy centers, matemity homes, and non-profit agencies on six continents. Heartbeat International assumed responsibility for APR operations, and global outreach. Dr. Delgado retained directorship of APR research and has founded the Steno Institute to serve as the platform for broader pro-life research, including abortion pill reversal. He was the author of the two most important articles in the medical literature describing and evaluating the successful reversal of mifepristone medical abortions. Additionally, Dr. Delgado was a co-author on Dr. Mary Davenport's high-impact paper reviewing the mifepristone literature to establish an historic control of embryo survival of mifepristone abortion, if no treatment is offered. Board certified in both family medicine and hospice and palliative medicine, Dr. Delgado received his medical degree from the University of California, Davis, and completed his residency at Santa Monica Hospital/UCLA. Dr. Delgado is certified in Health Care Ethics through the National Catholic Bioethics Center and is a Natural Family Planning Medical Consultant, having completed the NaProTECHNOLOGY physician training program.Dr. Delgado is nationally recognized for his pro-life medical expertise. He is a regular guest on the highly acclaimed Catholic Answers Live radio show, received the St. Gianna Molla Pro-Life Award at the 2017 Walk for Life West Coast, was awarded the Servant Leader Award in 2018 by Heartbeat International, and was granted the Pro-Life Innovator Award by Solidarity HealthShare in January 2019.

Fr. Thomas J. Loya



Fr. Thomas J. Loya, is a native Clevelander, Fr. Loya is a priest of the Byzantine Catholic Ruthenian Eparchy (diocese) of Parma. He is currently the pastor of Annunciation Byzantine Catholic parish in Homer Glen, IL. Prior to entering the seminary Fr. Loya pursued a career in art and design. Part of his seminary years were spent studying in Rome where Fr. Loya listened to Saint John Paul II deliver his monumental teachings on the human person.

During his priesthood Fr. Loya added to his fine art and theological degrees by earning a master's degree in Counseling and Human Services. He is the co-founder of the Tabor Life Institute for education and formation in the the-

ology of the body and eastern Christian spirituality. He is also the co-founder of Eastern Christian Media and Orientale Lumen TV. Fr. Loya has appeared on EWTN TV. He is the host of the radio program, "Light of the East" heard on EWTN affiliate stations throughout the country as well as on Ave Maria Radio in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He is also a regular guest on Dr. Gregory Popcak's radio program, "More to Life" also carried on EWTN and Ave Maria Radio. He does two minute, live, daily Facebook meditations of the teaching of the Church applied to the contemporary issues of our day. Fr. Loya maintains an active pastoral counseling schedule as well as an active public speaking schedule nationally and internationally. He also writes a column for two newspapers including the Horizons newspaper for the Eparchy of Parma.

Peter Range



Peter Range graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a Masters in Theology with a focus in Biblical Studies in 2009. Preceding Notre Dame, Peter received his Bachelor of Arts in History from John Carroll University in 2004. Peter has worked in ministries that include serving immigrant families in Florida, inner-city youth in Cleveland, university students in Bowling Green, Ohio, and the homeless in Cleveland and Toledo.

In January of 2022, Peter became the Executive Director of Ohio Right to Life (www.ohiolife.orq) after serving for 7 years as the Director of the Office for Life and Justice of Catholic Charities in the Diocese of

Toledo. Peter hosts his own radio show called "Say Yes to Life" which airs every Thursday in northwest Ohio at 4 pm on Annunciation Radio (www.annunciationradio.com) and every Sunday at 8:30 pm on Cleveland Catholic Radio's The Rock (https://am1260therock.com/). Peter has been published in The Federalist, appeared on EWTN's "Life on the Rock" as well as "Kresta in the Afternoon" and the "Catholic Connection" on Ave Maria Radio. The fifth of six children, Peter is passionate about family, service and encountering the one true God, Jesus Christ. Peter married his wife, Laura, in May of 2015. They reside in Northwest Ohio and they have five children.

Professor Janet Smith



Janet E. Smith recently retired from Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, MI. She is the author of Humanae Vitae: A Generation Later and A Right to Privacy. Self-Gift is a volume of her already published essays on Humanae Vitae and the thought of John Paul II. She edited Why Humanae Vitae is Right: A Reader; Life Issues, Medical Choices (with Christopher Kaczor) Living the Truth in Love: Pastoral Approaches to Same-Sex Attractions (with R. Paul Check); and Why Humanae Vitae is Still Right.

Professor Smith served three terms as a consulter to the Pontifical Council on the Family and also served as a member of the Anglican Roman Catholic International Commission, III for 8 years. She has a regular

column in the National Catholic Register. She has received three honorary doctorates and several other awards for scholarship and service. She has appeared on the Geraldo show, Fox Morning News, CNN International, CNN Newsroom, Al Jazeera, and has done many shows for various series on EWTN. More than two million copies of her talk, "Contraception: Why Not," have been distributed. Her materials can be found at janetsmith.org. Free copies of her talks are available there.
