My dear Friends,

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Blessed Sunday to all of you and your loved ones! I trust that my message found everyone well and sound and that you have been enjoying the autumn.

I have some good news to share with you. This past Thursday, October 5, 2023, I was officially sworn in as Chaplain of the United States Air Force with the rank of Captain at Youngstown Air Reserve Station in Vienna, OH. I was commissioned as an USAF Reserve officer and my first assignment is Whiteman Air Force Base in Missouri, yet, no worries, I am not leaving the parishes as I am currently a USAF Reserve officer and not active duty.

Why did I decide to become a United States Air Force chaplain? To me, it is not so much a question, but a statement. Aviation has been part of my life since the early childhood. I love the freedom of the sky. I love the airplanes. Having been born in Ukraine, at one point in my early life, I started dreaming of becoming an aircraft designer and was even thinking of studying at what is currently known as the National Aerospace University "Kharkiv Aviation Institute" – a known in Ukraine aviation school in the city of Kharkiv. Yet, as they say, if you would like to make God laugh, tell Him your plans. Instead of the sky heights, our Lord has decided to call me to soar to the spiritual heights: He called me to become one of His priests, and I have been a happy Ukrainian Catholic priest since my ordination in 2008, yet aviation never left my heart; it is still very much part of me.

So, how does the U.S. Air Force chaplaincy fit in here? As you know, my family and I became U.S. citizens last year (June 17, 2022): the joyful event that we have been anticipating for quite some time. Since we made the United States our home now, I finally decided to try to embody a thought that I was already entertaining for some time before: to try to become a U.S. Air Force chaplain – the reality, which, in my opinion, would combine my love of the priesthood with my love of aviation. I believe that being a priest is being in a special way close to the Lord spiritually. I also believe that being in the air is being in a special way close to our Lord physically. Hence, I thought that if, our Good Lord willing, I become a U.S. Air Force chaplain, I could take, with the Lord's help, both the spiritual and physical altitudes to the new heights – the heights that do not have as their aim my personal happiness, but the true happiness of the people that I would be called to serve: the courageous men and women of the U.S. Air Force, so that their service may be meaningful not only in the eyes of the U.S. Government and the People of this great country they've committed to serve, but, above all, in the eyes of our Lord Himself. My wife Natalia and our two sons, Svyatoslav and Iulian have been supporting me in this endeavor. And it happened. This day became a reality for me. Now the sky can become a passage on the way to Heaven for all the U.S. Air Force men and women and their families that I am called to serve.

Today I thank immensely and personally my Triune Lord: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, my Heavenly Mother Mary, all the Holy Angels and Saints, especially my daughter in Heaven Marichka, my entire family, especially my parents as well as my beautiful wife Natalia and our two sons, Svyatoslav and Iulian, the great U.S. Air Force family, and everyone else who has been part of this fulfilling journey. It's been a long and arduous path, yet this is just the beginning. Hence, I humbly ask you to please keep me and my family in your daily prayers as well as all the courageous men and women of the United States Armed Forces, especially of the U.S. Air Force — the greatest Air Force in the world — and their loved ones. Thank you very much, and may our Lord abundantly bless all of you, all the members of the U.S. Armed Forces, and all of your families through the intercession of the Most Holy Mother of God and all the Holy Angels and Saints! Aim high!

On a different note, since today we celebrate in America the **National Clergy Appreciation Day**, I would like to thank **Protodeacon Don** for his service to our Lord and His Holy Church during all of these years and wish him the abundance of our Lord's blessings in his diaconal service. Thank you, Protodeacon Don! We appreciate your service.

We, Ohioans, need to take unwavering action against the proposed pro-abortion amendment to Ohio Constitution and VOTE NO on this amendment on the **General Election Day, November 7th of this year** (registration deadline: October 10th) or whenever you'll be voting this year! In preparation for this important voting, there will be **March for Life on October 6th at the Ohio Capitol Building in Columbus** (to register and/or to receive info and updates via e-mail (even if you do not know for sure whether you will be going or not), please go to: https://p2a.co/XdMTG1x). Let us unite in prayer and action, reaffirming our firm YES TO LIFE and NO TO DEATH! IF OUR LORD IS WITH US, WHO COULD BE AGAINST US (cf. Sadly, the situation in our beloved Ukraine continues to remain grave. The country is still under a heavy attack from the side of Russia and whoever else sides with it in this horrible war... So many victims, including innocent children... How much longer will this bloodshed last? Right now, the People of Ukraine are being crucified... in fact, it is Christ Himself Who is being crucified again... Yet, life does not end with death! After the crucifixion and death comes resurrection! The resurrection will come for Ukraine as well! Today our risen Lord is embracing all people, who grieve due to having lost their loved ones because of the war in Ukraine, asking them to have faith in Him and not be afraid, for one day they will see their loved ones again, as this is a temporary absence. Today Jesus is telling the whole world just as He addressed His beloved friend Lazarus' sister Martha before Christ brought Lazarus back to life: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26 (NRSVCE)). Lord Jesus, we believe in You, give us life eternal!

In the meantime, let us continue to *pray and act* for the end of the war in Ukraine as well as for the conversion of Ukraine's aggressors and, as a Ukrainian citizen, I'd like to tell all of you: THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT OF OUR SUFFER-ING BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN UKRAINE! Ukraine direly needs our help right now! If you would like to help financially your brothers and sisters in Ukraine, please see a separate notice in the bulletin of how you can help. No amount is too small, yet please be generous, and I thank you in advance for your munificence! May our Good Lord reward you abundantly for it in this life and in the life to come!

Reverend Father Lubomir Zhybak and Parish Members:

The Ukrainian Cultural and Humanitarian Institute (UCHI) has been providing vital assistance to the children of the war on Ukraine through an advanced, intensive art therapy rehabilitation and skills development with our Ukrainian partners at the non-profit "Pyaternya" at their "Warm Hands" program for orphans, displaced children, and underprivileged youth. We are requesting your support to help us to continue to fund this life-changing program.

The next program is scheduled for October 21— 31 and we need an additional \$10,000 to fund the program. The Warm Hands program is most cost effective at only \$26 per day per child, and one hundred percent of all donations go to funding this life-changing program.

We are hoping to continue into 2024 funding this program that is garnering attention from all areas of Ukraine for its transparency, depth, and effectiveness. Not only do the children receive the palliative care of assistance for the trauma they have suffered, master artists, cooks, craftsmen, and other professionals help awaken and develop skills and talents that will help them in their personal and professional development for years to come and in rebuilding Ukraine when the war ends.

During each program session, we link the children of Warm Hands with members of our community in the area. In January the children were thrilled to hear the choir of SS Peter and Paul Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Carnegie singing Ukrainian kolyadky to them, and they responded in kind. Later in January, the children of the Ridna Shkola School of Ukrainian Studies of Pittsburgh sang together with the children of Warm Hands at a second program dedicated to Ukrainian Christmas traditions. In March, members of the Ukrainian Selfreliance of Western Pennsylvania Federal Credit Union spoke with the children and staff of Warm Hands, reciting poems of Ukrainian poet laureate Taras Shevchenko. In April, we showed them how much not only the members of SS Peter & Paul cherish their Ukrainian traditions while setting up for the annual pysanky sale and Ukrainian food festival. At the end of June, we traveled to All Saints Camp in Emlenton to introduce the children of Warm Hands to the children of ASC. And in August the children of the Kyiv Ukrainian Dance Summer School performed for the children of war in Ukraine.

Fifty children will participate in the October program — **children who were orphaned by the Russian invasion,** children whose parents are on the front protecting Ukraine's existence, **children from three orphanages in the Volyn' Oblast of Ukraine** including those with special needs, and **children who had been abducted by Russian forces and experienced brainwashing techniques before they were rescued and returned to their families in Ukraine.**

Program Director, Pyaternya Founder, and renowned artist of Ukraine Tetyana Myalkovska reports:

Art therapy is a very ecologically sound method of contact with the sub-conscious. The children have experienced a level of trauma, which prevents them from expressing their feelings and even discussing what they've experienced. So much is repressed, blocked by the psyche, and they forget what happened. But the trauma remains in the psyche. Through drawing, sculpting, sound therapy, physical therapy, it becomes unblocked. The dominant stress factors, the pain, the dominant events that cause trauma are released through art therapy as the children are taken from a traumatic, sad, blocked place to one of positive transformation. The children's artworks are actually cardiograms of the emotions of the children - visualizations of their dreams and hopes and also of their pain, fears, and despair."

Chief Psychologist Tetyana Shevtsova states:

At the beginning of the camp, the children demonstrated social isolation, low self-esteem, aloofness, excessive anxiety, aggressiveness, and demonstrative behavior, then at the end of the camp, the children opened up from a completely different angle.

UCHI's support has led to a multiplier effect with donations from other organizations and individuals in Ukraine, Poland, Germany, France, and the UK allowing further enhancements to and expansion of the program. The children learn skills such as culinary arts, fine arts, project development, construction, and develop their motor skills - providing a firm foundation for further development. Over 500 children have received help through the program to date.

Our local Ukrainian-American community has showed its strong support for the Warm Hands program with generous donations from Holy Trinity Ukrainian Catholic Church in Carnegie; St. Vladimir's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Pittsburgh's South Side; the UOL Chapter of St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Sharon, PA; the Vovk Foundation of Pittsburgh, PA; the Kyiv Ukrainian Dance Ensemble; Ukrainian Technological Society (UTS); and more.

We ask for your help to continue to make a difference in the lives of the children of the war in Ukraine.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ISSUE 1



What is Issue 1?

Issue 1 is a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would endanger the health and safety of women, threaten parental rights, and allow for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Ohioans will vote on November 7, 2023, whether to make this change to the Ohio Constitution.

What would Issue 1 do?

Put women at risk:

 Health and safety standards in Ohio could be eliminated. Doctors could no longer need to examine a woman or explain the risks of the abortion procedure ahead of time.

Threaten parental rights:

• A fifteen-year-old could have an abortion without her parents knowing. Current Ohio law requires parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion. These parental right protections could be removed as they directly conflict with the amendment which would allow all individuals, including minors, to make their own reproductive decisions.

Allow for abortions of fully formed babies:

 Abortion would be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy. Physicians at an abortion clinic could use a woman's age or emotional well-being as a reason to perform an abortion in the 3rd trimester.

Would abortion be illegal in Ohio if Issue 1 does not pass?

If Issue 1 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Ohio until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. This standard was challenged in court and placed on hold, allowing for abortions up to 22 weeks as of September 15, 2023. Current laws that protect the safety of women and parental rights would stay in effect.

Doesn't Issue 1 simply restore Ohio back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Issue 1 goes dangerously beyond what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It opens the door to remove important health and safety measures that protect women, threatens parental consent and notification of any minor seeking an abortion, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Issue 1 fails?

The passing or failure of Issue 1 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives when her life is in danger, even if the treatment results in the loss of life of her unborn child. There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Women can always receive lifesaving treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Ohio or any other state in the country.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faith-based and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born. Project Rachel helps those struggling post-abortion. Every woman should be able to depend upon a community for support and the Catholic Church remains committed to woman in need.
